#### Directions 2030 - feedback survey - went out Oct 6th, collected Oct 14th

- Thank you! For a great response. Responses are consistent with the Directions plan.
- Want to keep it simplistic and collaborative. We must be "Capable (in their abilities), Connected (to each other), and Contributing (to their community)". "We can do anything, but not everything".

#### **Child Care**

- With a small decline in enrolments across sd43, are looking at opportunities to bring in more daycares.
- Support transition of pilot programs to sustainable child care programs.

#### **Site Updates**

- **Hazel Trembath** got the \$\$\$. Cost = ~\$39Million. Will build a 240 seat capacity building. Meeting to discuss timeline in November.
  - Q Hazel Trembath would like more communication with parents about the process. Parents
    concerned that 240 seat capacity is too small. A SD43 will start conversations with parents within
    the next month. During construction communication with school community is planned to be similar
    to that for Moody Elementary School.
- Moody Elementary School building almost done will be moving to new site early January.
- Monty Middle School early stages of rebuild.
  - Q Moody Elementary original site what is the future plan? A. Plan is to keep that site as a school zoning to be available for future population growth.
- Secondary Site on Burke Mountain construction moving faster than anticipated.
  - Feedback survey went out to community last week, early. Survey out for 2 weeks.
  - **No** final decisions have been made. Considering catchment boundaries to reflect the needs and priorities of our school district.
  - Q Survey out is just for catchment area? A. Yes.
  - Q How was survey sent out? A. Was sent out through schools surrounding it to the families in that community.
  - Q Survey stats? A. Superintendent Tambellini will present at the next meeting.
- Q Have budget cuts applied to EAs? A There were some cuts on provincial level. But sd43 budget
  is pretty healthy right now. SD43 actually increased EA positions. Put out 10 more in September, and
  another new 34 positions since.

# **French Advisory Committee** (frim = French Immersion) - Sherie Bohorquez and Todd Gelinas **Language and Culture Coordinator Report: Shauna Beaton-Rae**

- 20% Elementary schools in sd43 have a Frim program, 57% Middle Schools have a Frim program.
- Universities no longer require a second lang courses to apply has affected all language programs.
- Gov devoted 30Million to supporting early literacy k-3 focus, but support k-12
  - Early literacy screening component criteria teachers now asked to submit data about literacy rates of their students tools piloted last year. All language programs will benefit from this funding.
- Official Languages in Education Programming (OLEP) Funding
  - New Need to submit a plan to show how the funding will be spent, not just end of year report.
  - There's still a formula based per student but will be adjusted based on what was spent. Left over \$ may be re-alocated to schools that have a plan that needs more resources.
  - Want to encourage teachers to be ask for what they need.
- Teacher Shortage is a national teacher shortage
  - # Frim practicum students is down in the province eq. SFU offered 40 places, only filled 23;
  - sd43 is trying to connect with student teachers at both UBC & SFU.
- Diplome d'études en langue française (DELF) exam
  - sd43 has highest # students that do it. 276 in 2024-25 students. ( <a href="https://delf-dalf.ambafrance-ca.org/presentation">https://delf-dalf.ambafrance-ca.org/presentation</a>)
  - DELF and DALF evaluate language skills in four areas: oral comprehension, oral expression, written comprehension, written expression.
- Learning progressions: proficiency descriptor for K-4 (new and in progress, hopefully out by spring)
  - UFLI foundations 100 lessons in collaboration with Angeline Humber.

- Activités Culturels Focus this year on French cultural activities that include the following:
  - Missy D coming 3 wks in Jan musical artist the kids may recognize from Manie Musicale
  - Concours d'art oratoire May 2026.
  - Festival du film

# Parent Report: Sherie Bohorquez & Todd Gelinas from DPAC

- Q. Class size capping for kindergarten. Is funding is being pulled from language programs?
  - **A. No.** Class sizes and number of new Frim classes created are influenced by both teacher and space resources available over the longterm. "If we bring in 1 more K Frim class, we need to guarantee now 12 more Frim teachers and classrooms to fully support those students up through grade 12".

# PRESENTATION - CONCUSSIONS - Shazya Karmali (PhD) from Concussion Alliance.

( <a href="https://www.concussionalliance.org/about-us">https://www.concussionalliance.org/about-us</a>) Dr. Shazya Karmali the Research Manager at the BC Injury Research and Prevention Unit (BCIRPU), at British Columbia Children's Hospital. Researches injuries across our full lifespan, children through adults. Concussion Alliance is a non-profit organization.

**What is a Concussion?** - brain contracts when there is an impact to the head. The axons can stretch and break and need time to heal.

- Brain = your information highway. A concussion = a 'traumatic brain injury'.
- Concussion numbers often under reported.
- Rates of concussions in high school is higher than in older athletes.
- \$400 Billion global cost to society.
- 'Precarious Traumatic Brain Injury'- with or w/o loss of consciousness. There is a time window of vulnerability for re-injury.
  - Subtle symptom onset, immediate or delayed. Symptoms can last day, weeks, or months.
  - Can't be seen on imaging.

**Active Recovery -** Current research supports an '*Active Recovery*' which includes relative rest, and light exercise. Multidisciplinary approach to recovery is best.

• Important to recognize that after a 1st concussion - (if player continues to play), they are 3 times more likely to sustain symptoms and take longer to recover.

# **CATT - Concussion Awareness Training Tool.** (Found at: <u>cattonline.com</u>)

- Courses recently updated. E-learning course for 8 different communities a learner centered model.
- Courses available 24/7 for FREE. Receive a certificate upon completion of each course. Can take as many as you wish.
- **CATT for Youth** high school aged. interactive course with videos and personal stories. Looks at 'What is a concussion? 'How can I manage symptoms?' 'How and who to ask for help'.
- CATT for Parents and Caregivers video based helps parents and caregivers support their child.
- **CATT for School Professionals** aimed for teachers, learning assistants and administrators. 'How to identify a concussion.' 'How to support a student coming back from a concussion.'
- **Resources** many different charts showing 'Return to School' steps after a concussion. Info sheets, Posters, medical clearance letter template. Available in English and French.
- CATT is mandated by BC school for sports. Also mandated for All school coaches and university athletes.

- **Q. Do you do anything with BC soccer or other organizations? A.** BC soccer does offer the course. Some organizations mandate the course, others recommended it.
- Q Does research look at appropriate time for contact in sports? Compare with other countries?.
- **A.** Research does exist. It's organization specific in terms of how much they relay to their coaches.
- Q. B/c teachers run gym time in lower grades. Is there intro of the course to teachers degree program? . A. Not at this time, but will bring it forward to them.

Dr. Karmali is happy to do presentations, host webinars, host professional development programs, or inclass presentations. No cost to presentations.
